Never before have so many people been packed into cities — places such as Los Angeles, Istanbul, Tokyo, and Lima — that are (1) regularly affected by earthquakes. (A) Located near the edge of Earth's huge, shifting plates, these cities face the risk of serious damage and (2) economic disaster from large quakes — as well as the tsunamis, fires, and other kinds of destruction they often cause.

We understand earthquakes better than we did a century ago. Scientists would like to be able them, but is this possible? Today, some of the simplest questions about earthquakes are still difficult to answer: Why do they start? What makes them stop? Perhaps the most important question (B) scientists need to answer is this: Are there clear patterns in earthquakes, or

In Japan, government scientists say they have an answer to the question. "We believe that earthquake 5 is possible," says Koshun Yamaoka, a scientist at the Earthquake Research Institute at Tokyo University. In fact, Japan has already predicted (C): the region of Tokai southwest of Tokyo. Here, two plate boundaries have (4) generated huge earthquakes every 100 to 150 years, but there hasn't been a major quake here since 1854. 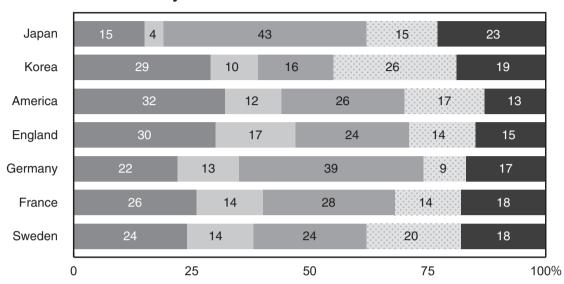

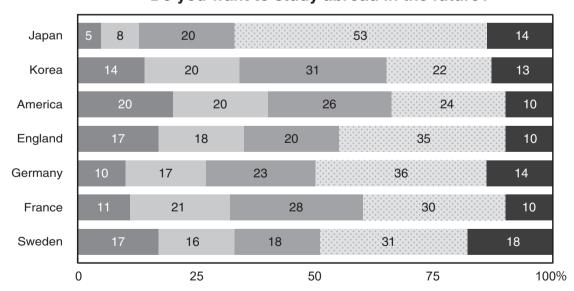
