<1>	According	to	official	numbers.	in	2018	Japan	recycled	an	impressive	84	perce

- <1> According to official numbers, in 2018 Japan recycled an impressive 84 percent of the plastic collected. (The US, (①) comparison, recycles about 9 percent.) Japan reaches this percentage through (A) recycling mechanisms. More than half of the collected plastic goes through thermal recycling, which means that the plastic waste is (B) in incinerators (②) generate energy.
- <2> Approximately 28 percent of the plastic is either reprocessed into new products (③) chemically recycled (C) down into its primary components and recombined (D) new products. Some sources indicate that part of these volumes end up being exported overseas. The residual 14 percent is not recycled at (④) and ends up being dumped or burned without energy recovery.
- <3> The main concern about this picture (E) the large portion of plastic waste going to thermal recycling. Burning plastic to generate energy is productive, (⑤) creates harmful emissions.

Ⅲ 次の電気自動車 (EV: electric vehicle) に関するアメリカ人対象の調査結果に基づいた英文を 読んで、(問1) ~ (問3) に答えなさい。

- <1> The percentage of Americans who say they would "definitely buy" an electric vehicle has more than (A) over the past two years, according to a new survey. That's a little less impressive than it seems (①) first glance: It went from just 4% of Americans in 2020 to 14% in the latest Consumer Reports survey of attitudes (②) electric vehicles. But the survey did (B) a hint as to how the figure could keep (C). One of the (D) predictors of whether someone said they would at least consider getting an electric car was, simply, whether they'd had any experience with one (③) real life.
- <2> Overall, 71% of respondents indicated at least some degree (④) interest in getting an electric vehicle, ranging from those who said they definitely would to 35% who said they just "might" consider getting one. Twenty-eight percent said they definitely would not purchase an electric car.
- <3> Almost half of those who said they would "definitely" buy or lease an electric vehicle had a friend, relative or co-worker who owned one. Of those who said they definitely would not, that figure was only 13%.
- <4> Similarly, 71% of the people who said they would "definitely" buy an EV had seen one in their neighborhood, while only 27% of those who wouldn't consider one had. Overall, about 44% of respondents said they have seen an EV in their neighborhood.
- <5> Also, far more of those who said they would buy an electric vehicle had been a passenger in one while very few of those (...) who would not consider an EV had ever ridden in one.
 Overall, though, the great (E) of Americans 83% according to the survey have still never ridden in, let alone driven, an electric vehicle.

- <6> Actual experience is particularly important for costly items (⑤) cars, said Deidre Popovich, an assistant professor of marketing at Texas Tech University.
- <7> "Product experiences provide us with sensory information which we can use to evaluate our enjoyment," she said in an email. "This is particularly important with high-value purchases such as a house or a car because we want to make sure we will be happy with our decision."
