< 1 > Have you ever heard the word “Bollywood”? It is not a name of a city in India. It is a ⁽¹⁾ coined word which indicates the Hindi language film industry. It was named after the city where this industry is based: Mumbai, whose name was Bombay when it started, and Hollywood in the U.S., which is world-famous as the center of the movie industry.

< 2 > Indian cinema has a long history. It goes back to the early 1900s, when movies were silent. Bollywood’s share in the total ⁽²⁾ revenue of the Indian film industry is the largest at 43% nowadays, but the share used to be bigger. That is why you sometimes see Bollywood movies and Indian cinema treated as ⁽³⁾ identical.

< 3 > In the mid-1900s, many influential Bollywood movies were made. In the 1960s, however, modern Bollywood movies were born. They started to use genres like action and romance, which had never been used in previous films. In the ‘70s, gang and crime movies were well-liked, and in the ‘80s and ‘90s musicals became increasingly popular.

< 4 > In the early 2000s, Bollywood reached countries outside India and started to gain box office success. *Slumdog Millionaire*, which won eight awards at the Academy Awards in 2009, is probably the most ⁽⁴⁾ crucial one. After this movie’s huge success, Hollywood and other global entertainment industries began to invest in Bollywood films. Between 2008 and 2013,

Bollywood films increased profits by 30% annually. India's film industry grew by 27% in 2017, much faster than the 9% for the nation's economy, and it reached a market size of \$2.6 billion in 2020. Now, Bollywood produces over 1,800 movies annually and it has a larger audience and sells more tickets than Hollywood. This is not surprising considering that India is the most populated country in the world.

< 5 > Bollywood films nowadays are known for their catchy music, energetic dances, colorful costumes, and interesting storylines. They are entertaining and fun. At the same time, they are also a great way to ⁽⁵⁾ explore Indian culture. Watching a Bollywood movie can give you a better understanding of the traditions, customs, and beliefs of India. Many of them deal with complex social issues such as poverty, corruption, gender inequality, and so on. Some of these issues are universal and they might give you an opportunity to think about them deeply.

< 6 > The last thing to mention is the aspect of language learning. Most Bollywood films are made in Hindi, which is one of the official languages in India. These days, however, some of them are made in English. Moreover, depending on the topic, actors often speak English in the films. In these cases, you will hear English with an Indian accent. In fact, this is a positive experience because we are living in a globalized world, where communication with people from India will likely be necessary.
